



# Glacial Till Farm

As sustainable farmers, we are committed to raising beautiful, high-quality produce for the people who choose to eat it. Our farmstead is located outside of Lake Norden, SD where we carefully farm just about two acres of glacial till soil without the use of synthetic chemicals. We are completely dedicated to building healthy soil, habitat for wildlife and beneficial insects, and a vibrant rural community.

## *Expected Harvest*

Members can expect to see 6 to 10 different vegetables each week for 20 weeks from the beginning of June through the middle of October. We raise approximately 250 varieties of vegetables in order to offer our members a diverse share, and to provide as much consistency as possible in South Dakota's unpredictable climate. ## What is a CSA?

Community Supported Agriculture directly links farmers and the land they tend with community members interested in investing their food dollars locally. Members join a CSA by purchasing a "share" in the farm at the beginning of the growing season, and in return, the farm provides the members with a weekly delivery of fresh produce. However, this relationship extends beyond a simple trade of money and food. In addition to receiving vegetables, members are encouraged to participate in the farm by attending farm events, touring the gardens, and getting to know the farmers. When members purchase a "share" they directly support and foster local economies and environmentally friendly farming techniques. the risks and rewards involved in the process of growing food.

Unlike most grocery store produce, the varieties raised at Glacial Till Farm are chosen for their outstanding taste and other aesthetic qualities. In order to preserve these characteristics in our food supply, we choose to grow almost exclusively heirloom and open-pollinated varieties.

**Distribution:** Shares will be delivered once a week from the second Friday in June through the second Friday in October (20 weeks), dependant on the weather.

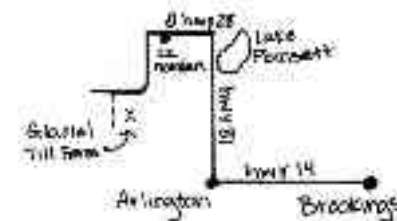
**Pick-up location and time:** Members are encouraged to pick-up their shares between 3pm and 6pm at Cottonwood Coffee located at 509 Main Avenue (across from the Post Office).

**Newsletters:** A membership includes a weekly newsletter that will keep members up-to-date with news from the farm, as well as storage tips and recipes for the week's vegetables.

**Additional Benefits:** Members will be able to request additional produce to be delivered with their weekly share. Please call by Wednesday night to request any extra vegetables. This is a great option to keep in mind if you're planning to entertain guests.

**New this year,** Glacial Till Farm will also be offering flowers and arrangements. We have chosen unique heirloom varieties as well as garden standards and we would love to share these beauties with our members. Orders can be placed by phone or at the pick-up site.

## Directions to Glacial Till Farm



From Brookings, head *west* out of town on Highway 14. Once you make it to Arlington, take Highway 81 *north* toward Watertown. Once you've passed Lake Pointsett, go *west* on Highway 28 toward Lake Norden. Highway 28 will take you past the lake of Lake Norden and the town of Lake Norden. Continue three more miles *west* on Highway 28 once you've left Lake Norden (the town). Turn south on 447<sup>th</sup> Avenue. At the second mile, the road bends to the *west*, follow that bend and turn *south* at the first driveway (the dashed line on the map). You've made it!!! You should expect to spend about 45-50 minutes in the car.
